Lay Directors Report for AGM 17th May 2025

Thank you all for coming today and thank you also for all the work that you are doing for Christ in your churches and communities.

Over the past year our focus has been on rebuilding the strength of our servant community. We have tried to provide monthly opportunities to meet, for study, prayer and encouragement.

There have been three diocesan Ultreyas over the past year as well as the National Ultreya in Sheffield last September. A group of us attended and the newly made Lichfield banner had its first outing! This year's National Ultreya is on 6th September in Durham. Tony and I will be attending and would encourage you all to think about coming along. Durham is a fabulous place to spend a weekend and the National Ultreya is a great experience.

Cursillo #65 was held at Foxhill in October. The LR Kate Ingelby worked very hard preparing her team for the weekend but unfortunately was not able to be on staff herself in the end due to contracting Covid the week before. Beth Roberts stepped up to lead the weekend and I filled in the OLR slot as best I could. The weekend was an overall success and it was particularly pleasing to see the chapel at Foxhill so full for the closing eucharist. In all we welcomed 5 new cursillistas from the Chester Diocese and 2 from the Lichfield Diocese. The team has been assembled for Cursillo #66 and Beth will be the 'official' LR this time around in October, again at Foxhill.

The November Ultreya at St Martin's, Poynton was a marvellous event with a visit from Bishop Sam who was very engaged with our programme and gave a relevant and thoughtful sermon during the eucharist. We were also blessed to have Rev. Swires-Hennessy, a very accomplished musician, to play the organ for us.

At the beginning of December, a very small (select!) group attended an Advent Quiet Day at St Paul's Macclesfield, led by Veronica. We had a thoughtful and productive day which set us on the right path for advent.

Our February Ultreya was hosted by the team at St Michael and All Angel's, Runcorn. Veronica gave us a very interesting talk on Icon painting and showed us some impressive pieces that she had painted herself on various retreats and courses. She is currently back in Lesvos at the moment attending another Icon painting course so I can't wait to see what she produces this time!

At the beginning of April we held a 'Cursillo Revisited' day at Foxhill. Despite some confusion on numbers and where to send the application forms to, 26 people managed to attend the day. The organising team of Nick and Sue Hutt, Tony, myself and Fiona put together a programme which revisited the 3 main staples of Cursillo Christian life; Prayer, Study and Apostolic Action. We also added a session on Self-Care to highlight the importance of looking after oneself to enable us to be able to serve effectively. The day was deemed a success and we plan to do something similar next year towards the end of February.

Lichfield have made great strides towards restarting Cursillo in the Diocese and now have a standing committee tasked with planning the way forward. This is likely to be a long term project and as such Chester and Lichfield will continue to work together for the foreseeable future. Lichfield hosted 2 events over the past year. One was a cream tea last June which gave people a taste of what to expect from a weekend and as a result of that we welcomed April and Jen on Cursillo #65. The other was a 'Spa Day for the Soul' in January which was well attended by people from 3 different diocese and even got a mention in BACC pages! (see the noticeboard!)

Looking to the future!

I'm confident that we are well on our way to rebuilding the 4th Day community following the glitch caused by the pandemic. However, we can't continue that positive direction unless some of you are prepared to take on roles on the secretariat. We have managed this past year without a Secretary, mainly by other members of the secretariat taking a share in the tasks that needed to be done. Unfortunately, our BACC rep has had to stand down and our communications officer has come to the end of her term, which means that there are now 3 vacancies on the secretariat. None of these roles are onerous, just a few hours work a month and could be shared by more than one person. I sincerely plead with you to search your hearts and consider whether you could take on one of these roles because if we can't find replacements then we will need to consider whether we can continue to run Cursillo in this diocese.

Once again, I would like to thank the secretariat and the rest of the team for their support and commitment., Sue & Nick Hutt, Denise, Vicki, Veronica, Carol and Julie; Ruth, Sue C, Janette, Joan, Sue L, Anne and Tony. Ultreya!

 Group Reunion?

If necessary be creative about how you meet up. Some used to meet up in car in a supermarket car park. Where could you meet if people are short of time or can't get together easily? We've met in Church itself sometimes...jolly chilly at St Mary's, Nantwich, but a good way of 'flagging up' the existence of Cursillo because you can explain what you're doing. Be open and welcoming though. Explain that if they're interested they'd be very welcome to join in this confidential faith-sharing under the headings of Prayer/ Study/Action. It's not actually necessary to go a Weekend to be a Group Reunion, though it is a delight. And of course -BE JOYFUL IN THE LORD-ULTREYA!
